









Goals

- provide a science-based, locally relevant, experiential education program focused on removal of Condit Dam
- engage student and community citizens in their local watershed





Main components

- In-class multimedia presentations at local schools
- Field trips to Condit Dam project area and other sites on WSR
- Education & outreach at community events, WS Library, and to landowners through workshops
- Community restoration project





Time frame

2009: grant awarded

2010: planning & contacting schools, pre-scheduling

2011-2013: presentations and field trips, community events

2013: community restoration project on the White Salmon River

In-class presentations

- **History & pre-history** of the basin

- **Future effects**: how will your backyard river look after dam removal? How long till salmon re-colonize, trees grow back..?
- Media: videos of breach, fish rescue & transport, news

- Pre-: NW lake boat launch, dam, flow line & surge tank
- Post-: Same areas as pre-, plus NW Bridge & Park
- Water quality monitoring (Henkle MS)


The White Salmon River welcomes returning Salmon for the first time in a century!

Landowner Education

Underwood Conservation District provided three workshops in 2011:



- Water rights, conservation and efficiency
- Livestock Management, including on-farm demos addressing manure, runoff, pasture health, vegetation buffering, and riparian health
- Stormwater Management and Low Impact Development to reduce runoff, keep clean water clean, manage stormwater, etc.
