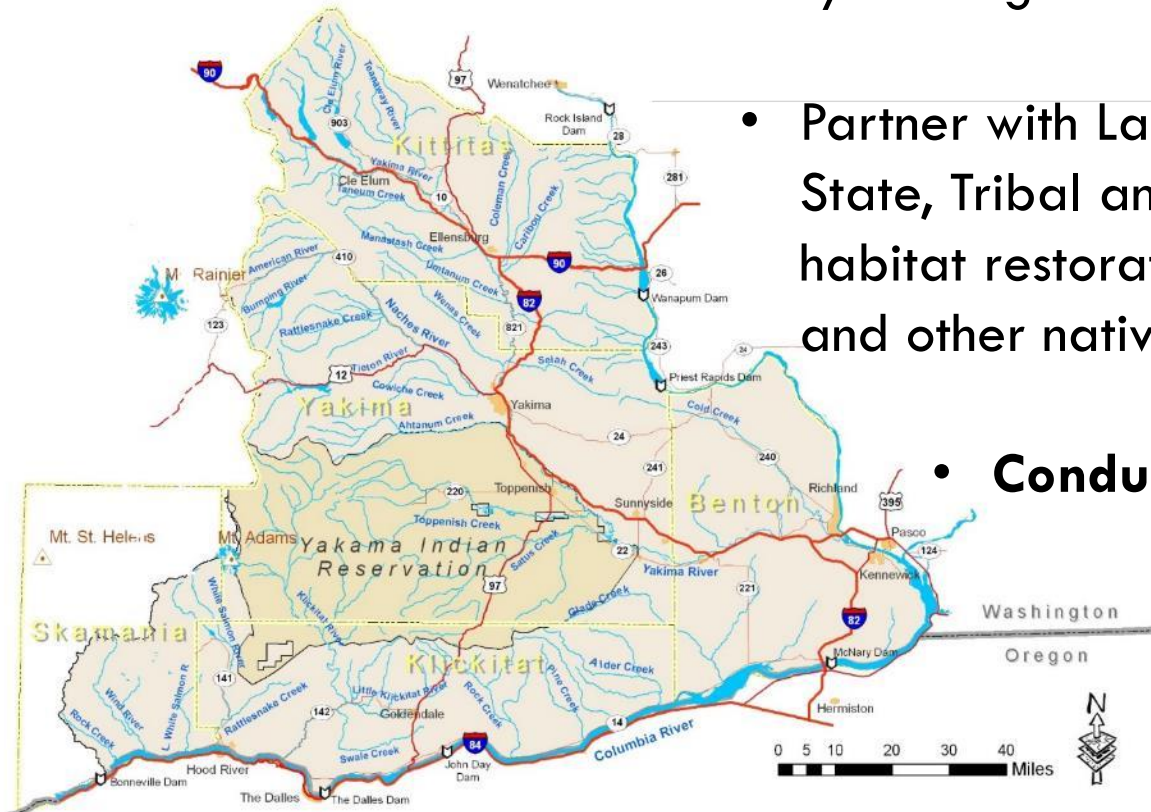


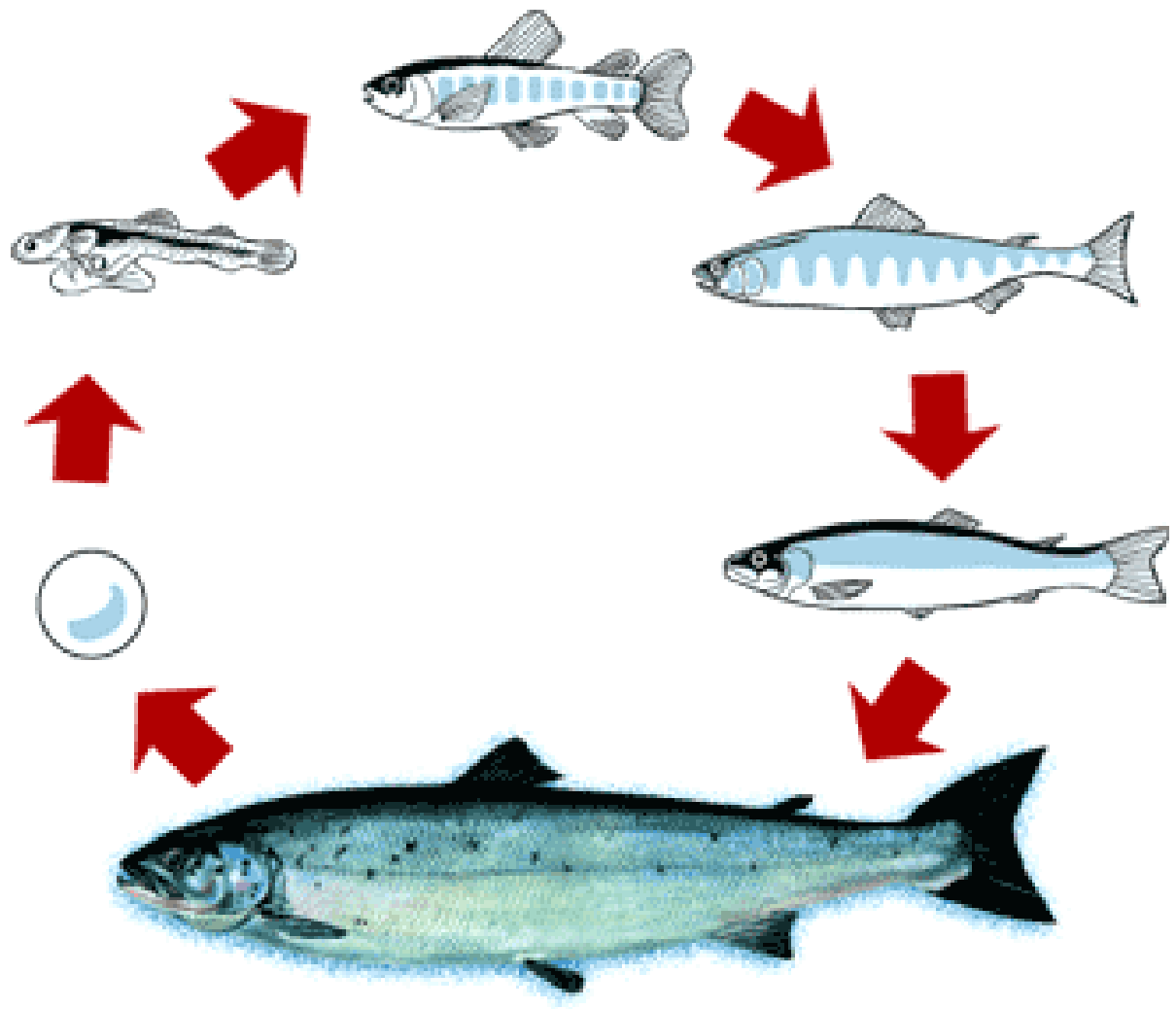

- **Conduct community outreach.**



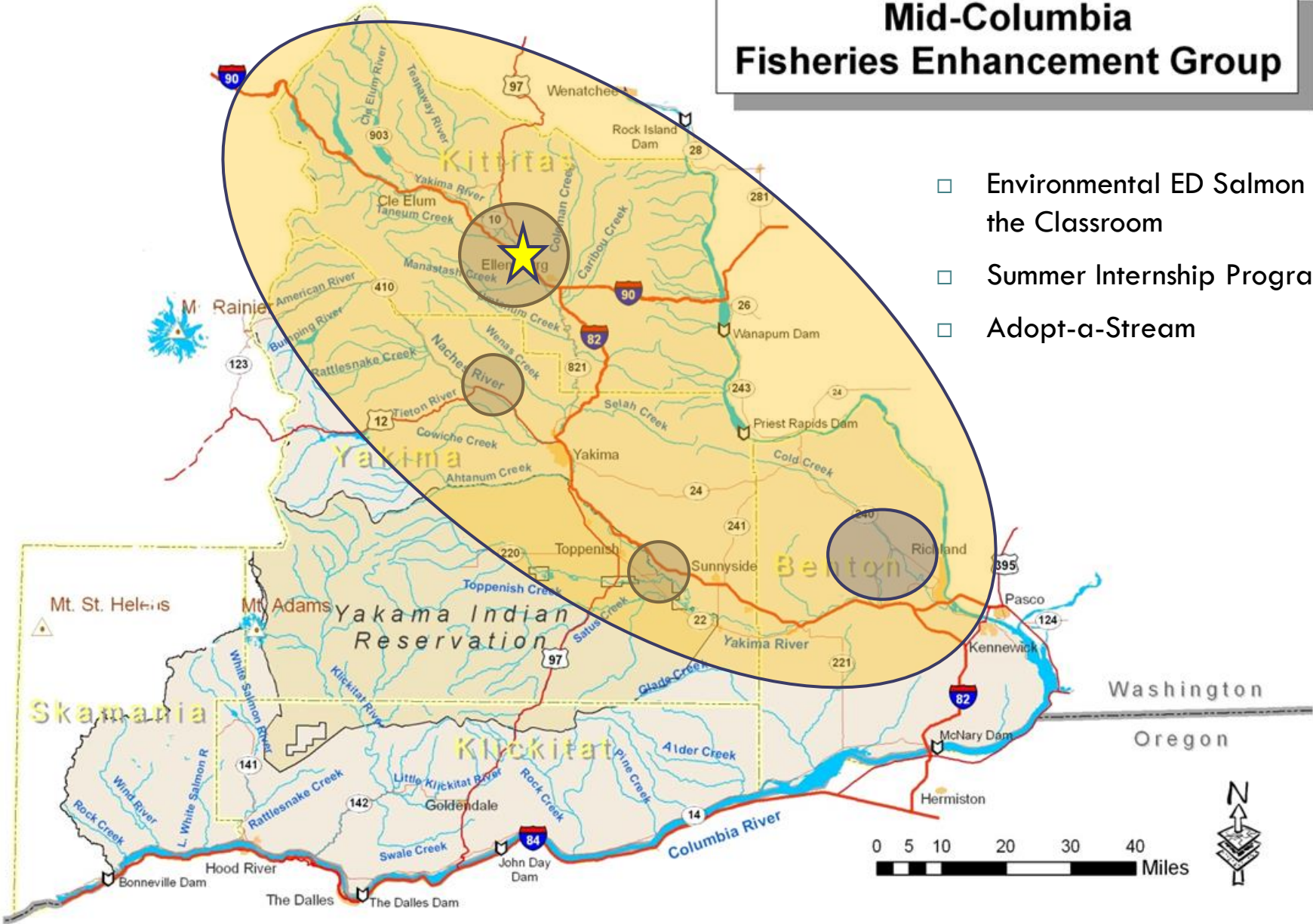

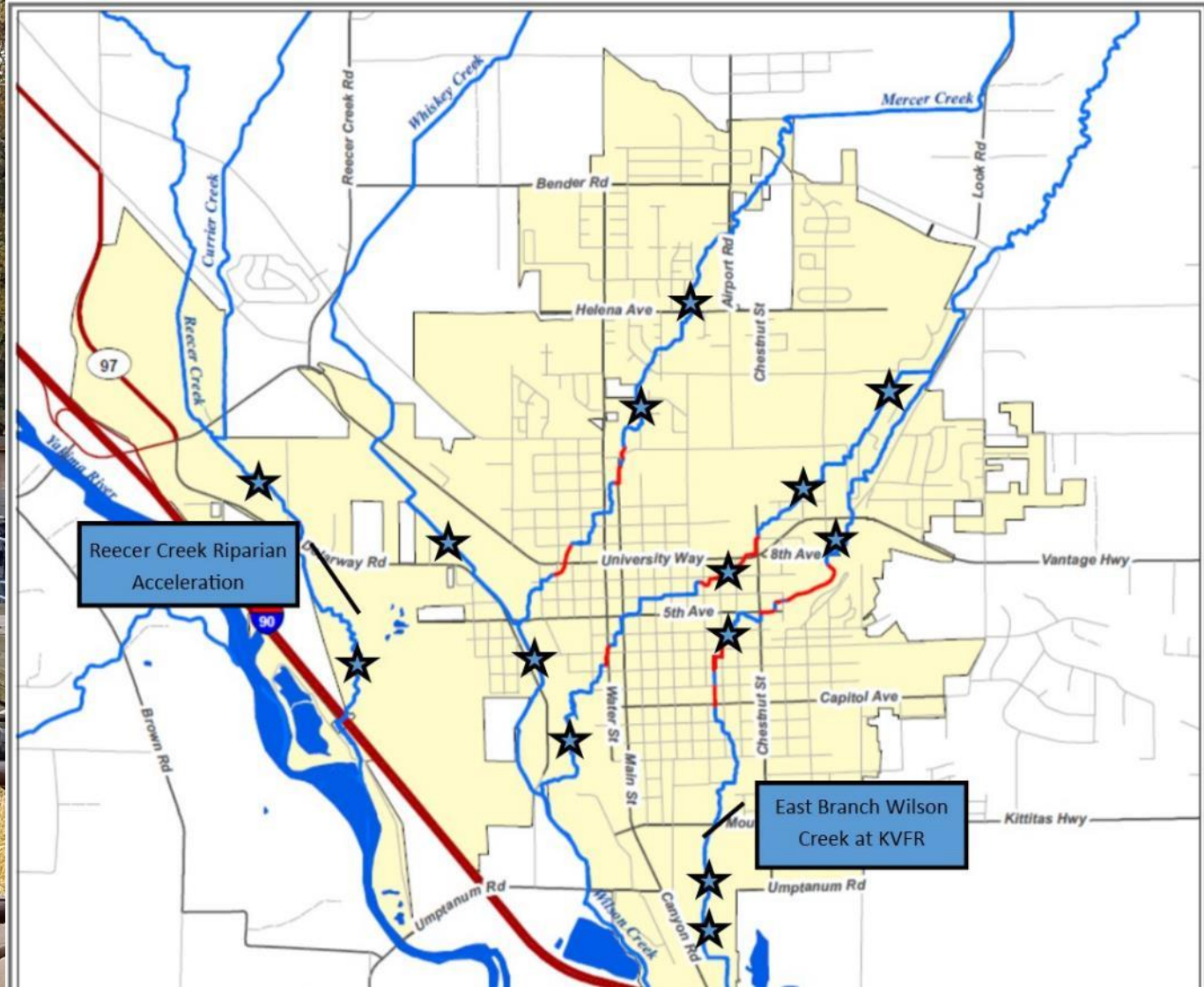
