



Kittitas Conservation Trust

- Mission: To protect and enhance fish and wildlife habitat, open space, cultural and recreational resources, and scenic views in the Upper Yakima River Basin.
- 3 Trustees: WDFW, YN, Suncadia
- KCT is a private, non-profit, conservation corporation founded in 2002.

Organization

- KCT: YN, WDFW & Trendwest Resorts (Suncadia).
- Cooperative Agreement: describes the corporate structure of the Trust, conservation goals and objectives, and basic fiscal framework.
- Primary Goal: no net loss of productive fish and wildlife habitat in connection with the development of the 6,000 acre Suncadia master planned resort near Roslyn.
- Incorporated: in Washington on June 19, 2002
 - **❖**501(c)(3)
 - *170(h) of the Internal Revenue Code
